 - vision
 - targets and
 - process.
- Generate involvement from new stakeholders and current stakeholders in the city.
- Get feedback to help plan the stakeholder engagement and dissemination strategy for the plan.






- Nearly 90% of respondents agree with the vision for sustainable energy and tackling climate change in Glasgow
- Nearly 50% of respondents agree Glasgow's target of 30% reduction in CO₂ emissions by 2020 should be maintained
- Nearly 70% of respondents are willing to share energy consumption data for the purposes of sustainable energy planning in the city
- 80% of respondents want to have some involvement in the new Energy and Carbon Masterplan
- Around 40% of the organisations already have an energy reduction target and carbon reduction target.








• 88% agree this vision is appropriate








• 48% think the 30% target should be maintained








Organisations participating in survey:

- 22% community/voluntary








Organisations who have an energy reduction

- No 45%








Organisations who have a carbon reduction target:

Yes - 41%








• 68% of respondents are likely to share energy consumption data








Participating organisations' interest in energy planning in Glasgow:

 - •> 50% Policy and Planning








Participating organisations' previous involvement in energy planning: •40% approx - some/significant involvement •35% approx – No involvement








Type of projects participating organisations involved in:

- 57% approx CHP/District Heating








Participating organisation member of partnership?

- 38% Not a member of a partnership body








Areas the participating organisations keen to contribute:

• 45% - Developing plans for energy and carbon reduction


40% - Staff Awareness

Survey Results: Q13 and Q14






69% of organisations have invested in low carbon or energy efficiency projects
 65% of organisations have plans to invest in low carbon or energy efficiency projects








Intended level of involvement in new plan:

- •30% Significant involvement








• 92% want to be kept informed of developments in the new Energy and Carbon Masterplan








How they want to be kept informed: 83% - E-Newsletter 65% - Attend workshops/Seminars 56% - Attend update meetings
